Narration

We gather to worship Christ, the newborn King; Jesus, the one foretold by prophets hundreds of years before His birth.

Isaiah once said that God's ways are not our ways; God's thoughts are not our thoughts. Never is that more evident than in the Christmas Story. Rulers, kings, and anointed leaders typically arrive from places of prominence with royal announcements and pedigrees. But in the birth of Christ, nothing follows the normal protocol. The prophet Micah foretold of the tiny village of Bethlehem from which this promised Messiah would come. Narration

The Second Article
