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About this evening's service.

As we gather:

Tenebrae is the Latin word for "darkness." As the candles are extinguished and lights dim, we reflect on our Lord's passion and death through Psalms and readings. At the end of this service, when the darkness of our sin is at its deepest and the powers of evil have apparently won, the light of Christ's resurrection shines deeply into us, scattering the darkness in our hearts and minds.

Although this service is solemn in nature, tonight we worship with joy as God's beloved children, His forgiven people, and we give thanks for the perfect life which Jesus offered as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

Notes on the Liturgy: The Psalms will be prayed responsively. The Officiant will pray the *italicized portions* and the regular print portions. **The congregation will pray the bold portions.**

Easter Morning:

We will celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord on Sunday morning at 7am and 10am. CREW is offering a breakfast with food service beginning at 8:30am.

There will be no presentation of the offering during the service this evening.

- P Make haste, O God, to deliver me! Make haste to help me, O LORD!
- C Let them be ashamed and confounded who seek my life; let them be turned back and confused who desire my hurt.
- P Let them be turned back because of their shame, who say, "Aha, aha!"

C Let all those who seek You rejoice and be glad in You; and let those who love Your salvation say continually, "Let God be magnified!"

- P But I am poor and needy; make haste to me, O God!
- C You are my help and my deliverer; O LORD, do not delay.

Psalm 63:1-8

God did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all.

- P O God, You are my God; early will I seek You; my soul thirsts for You; my flesh longs for You in a dry and thirsty land where there is no water.
- C So I have looked for You in the sanctuary, to see Your power and Your glory.
- P Because Your lovingkindness is better than life, my lips shall praise You.
- C Thus I will bless You while I live; I will lift up my hands in Your name.
- P My soul shall be satisfied with marrow and fatness, and my mouth shall praise You with joyful lips.
- C When I remember You on my bed, I meditate on You in the night watches.

P Because You have been my help, therefore in the shadow of Your wings I will rejoice.

C My soul follows close behind You; Your right hand upholds me.

I wait for the LORD, my soul waits.

- P Out of the depths I have cried to You, O LORD; Lord, hear my voice!
- C Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications.
- P If You, LORD, should mark iniquities, O Lord. who could stand?
- C But there is forgiveness with You, that You may be feared.
- P I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in His word I do hope.
- C My soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning—yes, more than those who watch for the morning.
- P O Israel, hope in the LORD; for with the LORD there is mercy, and with Him is abundant redemption.
- C And He shall redeem Israel from all his iniquities.

I wait for the LORD, my soul waits.

Hymn "Jesus I Will Ponder Now" LSB #440 vs 5-6

The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ John 19 So then Pilate took Jesus and scourged Him. ² And the soldiers twisted a crown of thorns and put it on His head, and they put on Him a purple robe. ³ Then they said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they struck Him with their hands. ⁴ Pilate then went out again, and said to them, "Behold, I am bringing Him out to you, that you may know that I find no fault in Him." ⁵ Then Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. And Pilate said to them, "Behold the Man!" ⁶ Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him." ⁷ The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to our law He ought to die, because He made Himself the Son of God." ⁸ Therefore, when Pilate heard that saying, he was the more afraid, ⁹ and went again into the Praetorium, and said to Jesus, "Where are You from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. ¹⁰ Then Pilate said to Him, "Are You not speaking to me? Do You not know that I have power to crucify You, and power to release You?" ¹¹ Jesus answered, "You could have no power at all against Me unless it had been given you from above. Therefore the one who delivered Me to you has the greater sin." ¹² From then on Pilate sought to release Him, but the Jews cried out, saying, "If you let this Man go, you are not Caesar's friend. Whoever makes himself a king speaks against Caesar." ¹³When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the iudament seat in a place that is called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha, ¹⁴ Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour. And he said to the Jews. "Behold your King!" ¹⁵ But they cried out, "Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar!" ¹⁶ Then he delivered Him to them to be crucified. Then they took Jesus and led Him away.¹⁷ And He, bearing His cross, went out to a place called the Place of a Skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha, ¹⁸ where they crucified Him, and two others with Him, one on either side, and Jesus in the center. ¹⁹ Now Pilate wrote a title and put it on the cross. And the writing was:

JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS.

²⁰ Then many of the Jews read this title, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin. ²¹ Therefore the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but, 'He said, "I am the King of the Jews." ' " ²² Pilate answered, "What I have written, I have written." ²³ Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His garments and made four parts, to each soldier a part, and also the tunic. Now the tunic was without seam, woven from the top in one piece. ²⁴ They said therefore among themselves, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall

be," that the Scripture might be fulfilled which says: "They divided My garments among them, and for My clothing they cast lots." Therefore the soldiers did these things.²⁵ Now there stood by the cross of Jesus His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing by. He said to His mother, "Woman, behold your son!" ²⁷ Then He said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And from that hour that disciple took her to his own home. ²⁸ After this, Jesus, knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, said, "I thirst!" ²⁹ Now a vessel full of sour wine was sitting there; and they filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on hyssop, and put it to His mouth. ³⁰ So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "It is finished!" And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit. ³¹ Therefore, because it was the Preparation Day, that the bodies should not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. ³² Then the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and of the other who was crucified with Him. ³³ But when they came to Jesus and saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. ³⁴ But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out. ³⁵ And he who has seen has testified, and his testimony is true; and he knows that he is telling the truth, so that you may believe. ³⁶ For these things were done that the Scripture should be fulfilled, "Not one of His bones shall be broken." ³⁷ And again another Scripture says, "They shall look on Him whom they pierced." ³⁸ After this, Joseph of Arimathea, being a disciple of Jesus, but secretly, for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus; and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took the body of Jesus. ³⁹ And Nicodemus, who at first came to Jesus by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds. ⁴⁰ Then they took the body of Jesus, and bound it in strips of linen with the spices, as the custom of the Jews is to bury. ⁴¹ Now in the place where He was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. ⁴² So there they laid Jesus, because of the Jews' Preparation Day, for the tomb was nearby.

Psalmody

Isaiah 53

And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

- P Who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- C For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant, and as a root out of dry ground.
- P He has no form or comeliness;
- C And when we see Him, there is no beauty that we should desire Him.
- P He is despised and rejected by men, a Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief.
- C And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.
- P Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows;
 C Yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted.
- P But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities;
- C The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed.
- P All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, every one, to his own way;
- C And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.
- P He was oppressed and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth;
- C He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth.
- P He was taken from prison and from judgment, and who will declare His generation?
- C For He was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgressions of My people He was stricken.

- P And they made His grave with the wicked—but with the rich at His death,
- C Because He had done no violence, nor was any deceit in His mouth.
- P Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise Him; He has put Him to grief. When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in His hand.
- C He shall see the labor of His soul, and be satisfied. By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, for He shall bear their iniquities.
- P Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the great, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong,
- C Because He poured out His soul unto death, and He was numbered with the transgressors, and He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

The candle is removed.

The Strepitus (A loud sound symbolizing the stone being rolled in front of the tomb)

The candle is returned. (symbolizing that our Easter Hope is coming!)

The omission of the Benediction tonight indicates that our worship is not yet complete until we are joined together to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

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
